



IIC Dining Guidelines

Rules and Regulations

Tables Reservation:

In the Dining Hall of the Main Centre, a Member can book a table for maximum of 8 persons and in the Dining Hall, Annexe for 10 persons.

There is no provision of reservation for table in the Lounge and Bar.

Maximum of four persons are allowed at a table in the Bar.

Restrictions for admission of children in the outlets:

Children below 8 years of age are not allowed in the Dining Hall of both the Main Centre and Annexe. Members accompanied by children who visit the Lounge may use the outer Veranda of the Lounge in the Main Centre. In the Annexe Lounge, children below 8 years of age accompanying members are allowed to avail of catering facilities only during lunch hours on Saturday, Sunday and other Public Holidays between 12:30 pm to 2:30 pm.

Joining of Tables:

Tables are not allowed to be joined in any of the catering outlets.

Dress Code:

Members using Bar, Lounge or Dining facilities are requested to note that shorts are not permitted.

Carrying of Membership Cards:

Members are requested to carry their Membership Cards with them and produce it when requested to do so by our staff members.

Cash Payment:

Cash transaction in the Dining Hall, Lounge and Bar of both the Main Centre and Annexe is not permitted. Members are requested to settle their bills through Smart Card, Credit or Debit Card for the facility used by them

Guests:

All Members are requested to enter the number of guests in the Guest Register before occupying the table.



Cell Phones:

The use of Cell Phones is not permitted in the Dining Hall, Lounge, and Bar. Cell Phones must be kept in the Vibration mode.

Conversing Loudly:

Members are requested to speak in a manner that does not disturb those seated at the neighbouring table.

Non-Smoking:

It is clarified for the information of the Members that smoking is prohibited in public areas in the Centre both under the Central Act namely. "The Cigarettes and other Tobacco Products Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production, Supply and Distribution Act 2003" and under the "Delhi Prohibition of Smoking and Non-Smokers Health Protection Act, 1996".

We have already been observing the provision of these acts and sign boards of 'NON-SMOKING ' have been put up in all places like library, offices, auditorium, conference rooms, committee rooms, lounge, lounge veranda, dining hall and bar etc.

Members are requested to cooperate in implementing these statutory provisions.
